

India Poised to Become the MICE Capital of the World: Union Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat



Inaugurating the two-day seminar themed "India: The Land of Exponential Growth", Union Minister of Culture and Tourism Gajendra Singh Shekhawat highlighted the unprecedented infrastructure developments propelling India into the MICE spotlight.

"With state-of-the-art exhibition and convention centres now coming up in cities like Mumbai, Delhi, Hyderabad, Bangalore, Jaipur, and several Tier-2 destinations post-G20, India is standing at the threshold of strong possibilities. We are on track to becoming the MICE capital of the world," said Mr Shekhawat.

He emphasized the need for strategic partnerships between government agencies and the private sector to bring global events to India. The Minister also underscored the transformative impact of India's infrastructure boom since 2014—spanning over 150,000 km of roads, modernized railway stations, semi high-speed trains, inland waterways, and more than 150 operational airports—all of which are vital enablers for the MICE industry.

ICPB Welcomes Shri M. R. Synrem as New Chairperson Joint Secretary, Ministry of Tourism, Government of India, Takes Charge

hri M. R. Synrem, an officer of the Indian Administrative Service (IAS) from the 2002 batch (Assam-Meghalaya cadre), is currently serving as Joint Secretary in the Ministry of Tourism, Government of India.

Shri Synrem has held diverse positions in the Government of Meghalaya, across multiple sectors. Shri Synrem has contributing significantly demonstrated strong administrative acumen, having led key departments Such as Information Technology & Communications, Transport, Urban Affairs, and Commerce & Industries. He has also served as Secretary, Health & Family Welfare, Mission Director of the National Health Mission (Meghalaya), and CEO of the Megha Health Insurance Scheme, where he played a crucial role in strengthening health systems and public service delivery in Meghalaya.

Since assuming charge as Joint Secretary in the Ministry of Tourism in January 2023, Shri Synrem has been instrumental in planning and implementing major infrastructure development initiatives such as the Swadesh Darshan 2.0, PRASHAD, and Challenge-Based Destination Development Schemes. His inter-agency responsibilities include coordination, Convergence with infrastructure departments, project monitoring, and ensuring alignment with Sustainable and inclusive development goals.

In the domain of international cooperation, Shri Synrem has led India's participation in major global tourism platforms, including UNWTO, BRICS, and G20, and has facilitated bilateral engagements and MoUs to promote inbound tourism, investment, and knowledge exchange.

As the head of the Administration Division in Ministry of Tourism, he is human resource responsible infrastructure for procurement, functions, managing maintenance, IT systems, and parliamentary affairs. His responsibilities include handling establishment matters such as appointments, transfers, postings, promotions, retirements, and coordination with agencies like

UPSC, DOPT, and SSC. Shri Synrem has also supervised the framing of Recruitment Rules, service record maintenance, pay fixation, MACP, leave, LTC, and training programs. Additionally, he has played a key role in Supporting the implementation of e-Governance and IT initiatives within the and ensured Ministry, effective coordination of all Parliament-related activities in liaison with the Lok Sabha/Rajya



Sabha Secretariats and the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs.

He actively engages with key industry stakeholders and associations to strengthen public-private collaboration and shape tourism policies. His leadership has supported India's presence in major international tourism exhibitions and trade fairs and driven domestic campaigns promoting inter and intra-state tourism in partnership with states and industry bodies contributing to increased tourism-driven economic activity and employment generation.

In October 2023, Mr. Synrem took additional charge as Managing Director of ITDC, alongside his role as Joint Secretary & Additional Director General in the Ministry of Tourism. Under his leadership, ITDC achieved a record turnover of F545 crore and profit before tax of 110 crore. Key initiatives during his tenure included the company's rebranding with a new tagline and mascot, and a strategic re-entry into the Duty-Free Shop business at airports. A notable achievement was the swift and successful setup of the Tent City at Mahakumbh 2025 in Prayagraj, which earned wide appreciation from both government authorities and the public.

ndia's potential as Global MICE destination is unlimited, thanks to it's World class infrastructure, rich cultural heritage and strategic location. India has emerged as a preferred destination for Global and Regional Business Events. MICE tourism sector has seen a transformative growth.

India climbed the ICCA ranking at number 28 with 141 meetings at the Country level have also shown the improved city ranking.

In Asia Pacific India ranked 7th in the Region while Japan topped the list. Japan with 428 meetings, China with 249, Republic of Korea with 243, Australia with 227, Thailand with 158, Singapore.



At the country level, the United States remains the topranked country, followed by Italy, Spain, Germany, and the United Kingdoms.

In 2024, global travel and tourism generated an economic impact of approximately USD 10.9 trillion, accounting for about 10% of global GDP, supporting around 357 million jobs worldwide. According to ICCA's 2024 data, international association meetings contributed USD 11.6 billion in immediate economic impact, a specialised yet important segment within the global tourism sector.



Current challenges and encouraging Developments

While the potential of MICE in India is enormous, the industry currently suffers from a fragmented approach. Stakeholders often operate in silos, lacking a holistic understanding of the MICE ecosystem. This leads to duplication of efforts and inefficient use of resources. Furthermore, the sector remains largely unorganised, with limited collaboration across players.

However, there are encouraging signs. Both Central and State Governments have recognised MICE as a high-yield segment and are investing in world-class infrastructure—modern convention centres, better connectivity, and partnerships with global organisers. Post-G20, India has showcased its ability to host large-scale events, but consistent efforts are needed to attract similar global gatherings.

A strategic push towards Global MICE leadership

To position India as a leading MICE destination, there is an urgent need for a central nodal agency like the India Convention Promotion Bureau (ICPB) to act as a unified voice and strategy body. A National MICE Strategy is essential, bringing together the collective experience of stakeholders under one umbrella. The Ministry of Tourism's recent participation in the ICCA Congress is a positive move towards international collaboration.

India must showcase its strengths—rich culture, heritage, and emerging Tier 2 and Tier 3 cities—alongside developing world-class digital and physical infrastructure. Marketing efforts, both by a national bureau and through Indian embassies abroad, need to be aggressive and consistent. A long-term MICE policy, sustainability focus, and coordinated efforts between government and private players will be crucial in scripting India's MICE success story.



Insights from Ashish Jagota Governing Board Member, ICPB

Policy or infrastructural developments needed to elevate India's competitiveness in the global MICE arena

Policy Developments

- MICE-specific policies: Formulate policies tailored to the MICE industry, offering incentives to event organizers and venues.
- Visa facilitation: Streamline visa processes for international delegates to boost participation.
- Tax incentives: Provide tax benefits for MICE-related activities, including event hosting and infrastructure development.
- Regulatory framework: Establish a clear and supportive regulatory environment to encourage growth in the sector.



- World-class convention centres: Develop modern, tech-enabled centres with flexible layouts and large capacities.
- State-of-the-art venues: Invest in premium venues such as exhibition halls, auditoriums, and meeting spaces.
- Enhanced connectivity: Strengthen transport infrastructure airports, hotels, and local transit—to ensure smooth delegate movement.
- Digital infrastructure: Build robust digital capabilities like high-speed internet and virtual platforms to enable seamless hybrid events.

Additional Initiatives

- Destination marketing: Launch targeted campaigns to promote India as a premier MICE destination.
- Event management support: Offer logistical assistance and bid support to MICE organisers.
- Industry-academia collaboration: Encourage partnerships to foster research and talent in the MICE domain.
- Sustainability focus: Promote eco-friendly practices like waste reduction and carbon footprint minimisation.

By implementing these initiatives, India can significantly strengthen its position in the global MICE landscape and attract more international events.
