he opening day of SATTE 2025 witnessed a crucial discussion on "India's MICE Market: Prospects & Potential." The session, led by Smt. Mugdha Sinha, IAS, Director General, Tourism, Government of India, brought together key industry leaders to deliberate on the growth trajectory and opportunities within India's burgeoning Meetings, Incentives, Conferences, and Exhibitions (MICE) sector.

India's MICE industry, currently valued at \$3.3 billion, is projected to reach \$10.5 billion by 2030, highlighting its immense potential on the global stage. The panel featured distinguished experts, including Mr. Chander Mansharamani, Managing Director, Alpcord Network Travel & Conferences, Mr. K.B. Kachru, Chairman – South Asia, Radisson Hotel Group, Mr. Mohammad Ali, Vice President – Development & Operations, Accor, Mr. Yogesh Mudras, Managing Director, Informa Markets – India, and Mr. Hyung Phil Chung (CEO, KINEXIN Convention Management). Together, they explored strategies to position India as a premier global MICE destination.











Smt. Mugdha Sinha emphasized the critical need for collaboration between the government, hospitality sector, event organizers, and other stakeholders to drive MICE growth. She also underscored the importance of international associations such as ICCA (International Congress and Convention Association), AIPC (International Association of Convention Centres), and UIA (Union of International Associations), which play a vital role in ranking and promoting global MICE destinations. A key announcement from her address was the Ministry of Home Affairs' ongoing efforts to introduce a special MICE visa, aimed at streamlining entry procedures for international delegates and enhancing India's competitiveness in the global MICE market.

Mr. Chander Mansharamani highlighted the urgent need for a dedicated central agency to market India as a convention destination effectively. He also stressed that India must introduce financial incentives and policy support, similar to what other leading MICE destinations offer, to attract large-scale international

conferences and exhibitions.

Mr. Mohammad Ali reinforced the importance of stronger synergies between hotels, convention venues, and event planners to maximize India's potential. While he acknowledged the world-class convention infrastructure India now boasts, he pointed out that more aggressive global marketing efforts are required. He also emphasized the necessity of simplified customs procedures and streamlined entry formalities to facilitate hassle-free participation of foreign corporations and exhibitors.

The discussion concluded with a unanimous agreement that while India possesses the infrastructure and potential to emerge as a global MICE powerhouse, achieving this goal will require strategic marketing, sustained government support, and robust industry collaboration. With the right policies and initiatives, India can firmly establish itself among the top destinations for international business events, congresses, and conventions.

MICE Update

Rushikonda Bungalow in Vizag may be transformed into a MICE Centre



The Rushikonda bungalow, a luxurious structure overlooking Vizag's scenic beachfront, may soon be repurposed into a MICE centre to boost tourism, according to Kandula Durgesh,

Minister for Tourism, Culture, and Cinematography. Speaking at the Vizag Regional Investors Meet, Durgesh criticized the previous administration for neglecting the tourism sector and demolishing key tourism department buildings. While he did not directly name the Rushikonda bungalow, he indicated that the government is assessing the feasibility of converting large bungalows in Vizag into MICE facilities to attract business events and visitors.

Cuttack Development Authority invites bids for Convention Centre



The Cuttack Development Authority (CDA) has invited proposals for the development of a convention centre-cumkalyan mandap at Sector 8, Cuttack. The project will be built on 42,070 sq. ft. of land in a planned development

zone, which includes residential, commercial, recreational, educational, and healthcare facilities. As per the Expression of Interest (EOI) issued, the CDA will grant permissive possession of the land for 30 years, with the selected developer responsible for building and managing the convention centre. The initiative is expected to enhance the city's event-hosting capabilities.
